Counting Our Days – Ordinary Time

We've entered the longest season of the Church year, the Season after Pentecost. This season, and the time between Christmas and Lent, called Epiphany, make up what the Church calls "Ordinary Time". We might ask "what's so ordinary about seasons that begin with the Epiphany and the great mystery of the Holy Trinity?"

First, we need to understand more about the word "ordinary". The name of these seasons comes from the word "ordinal" which means "to count". We will number our Sundays for twenty-seven weeks from now until November 24th when we will celebrate Christ the King and the last day of the liturgical year.

The Season after Epiphany and the Season after Pentecost make up our scriptural journey through the life of Christ. We celebrate the life and teaching of Jesus, seeking to walk more closely with him. These are the great, green, growing Sundays of the Church and a wise theologian of our time, Mike Kyle, has said that the seasons we call ordinary are the seasons of putting our pants on one leg at a time and getting down to the business of *being* the Church. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

Taking the name of this season as the word is *ordinarily* defined might be useful. That which is ordinary is commonplace. Ordinary is normal. Pentecost then could be a time when the ordinary, commonplace, and usual course of our days and weeks include time for prayer, study of God's Word, and worship in the community we call "Church". What a beautiful way to count our days.
