A Harvest of Righteousness

All over the countryside there are fields of cornstalks and soybeans that are turning from vibrant green to golden yellow to brown. The brown, dry corn and beans are ready to be gathered into the granary. These fruits of the farmers' labor will provide food for people, feed for livestock, and other commodities. Just a few days from now the harvest moon will rise over those fields and is so named because its appearance in the sky marks the time of harvest, year in and year out.

Images of planting, sewing, and reaping are plentiful in scripture. Today I am reading about a different kind of harvest, found in the book of James. James 3:17-18 says "...the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace."

So, what about the "harvest of righteousness"? The Greek word which is translated as righteousness is "Dikaiosune" and speaks to the character of relationships. We understand a righteous person to be honorable and virtuous. At the heart of the righteousness that James speaks of is being in right relationship with God, with other people, and with creation. The righteous person strives to live justly, honestly, faithfully, and in peace with others, according to God's instruction. Righteousness is not a destination or a goal; it is a journey and a relationship.

Just like the farmer has fields to tend, we have spiritual lives to nurture. We plant and tend, seeking a harvest righteousness. We care for our spiritual garden with prayer, study of the Scriptures, fellowship, and worship. Through faith, and with the grace of God, we will realize a harvest like the one James described. A harvest that is pure, peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, and full of mercy.
