The Peace of Christ Regulates Our Hearts

Our Christmas cards and greetings this time of year wish a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to our families, friends, and neighbors. We also often include a wish for peace on earth. Humanity longs for peace today, just as the people living under Roman occupation did in the time when Jesus was born.

The Gospel we shared on Christmas eve (Luke 2:1-14) ends with the Heavenly Host singing *Glory to God and peace on earth.* And so we make a glorious song to God and pray, as always, for peace.

The apostle Paul had something to say about peace. Paul encouraged the Colossians to live Godly lives. In chapter 3, verses 14-15 he wrote, Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful.

The Greek word translated here as *rule* could also be *govern* or *regulate*, and what Paul is calling us to regulate is our own heart. This is a *put your own oxygen mask on first* kind of instruction. You see, when traveling by plane, we are told that if the oxygen mask drops down in front of us, we are to put our own on first because if we try to help someone else first, we are likely to faint from a lack of oxygen. Sometimes, to be a part of the solution, we must first make sure that we don't become a part of the problem.

Paul wisely tells us to cover or clothe ourselves in love, and to let Christ's peace be the governor of our hearts, so that we will be dressed and ready to go, doing the work of sharing the love of God in Christ and the peace that comes with it.
